#### **Director of Administrative and Legislative Affairs**

Christina Colla is the director of Administrative and Legislative Affairs for the Defense Commissary Agency (DeCA), responsible for maintaining favorable and influential representation of the agency with Congress, the Department of Defense (DOD), the military departments/services, other governmental agencies, other DOD resale entities, advocacy groups and trade associations on all agency issues. Her selection was effective Dec. 18, 2023.

In this position, Ms. Colla serves as the agency director's representative with all government entities, defense advocacy groups and trade associations. She is responsible for collecting and providing information on proposed policy and on the status of policy proposals in progress. Ms. Colla is also charged with identifying and assessing executive political environments, and formulating, coordinating and conducting DeCA financial and budget-related business with DOD, the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) and the Department of Treasury.

Ms. Colla also serves as the chief of the Command Group's Administrative Division in the Headquarters and Support Center.

Before joining DeCA, Ms. Colla was the assistant chief of policy for the United States Marshals Service (USMS) in Arlington, Virginia, from 2020 to 2023, where she was responsible for the creation and execution of more than 300 agency policies, SOPs, and policy memoranda. While there she spearheaded a complete overhaul of the policy review process, which led to a more efficient method, ensuring that all necessary parties were part of the process. Ms. Colla also overhauled the USMS' Office of Policy intranet site to ensure it was more consumer-focused.

In 2021, while attending the Executive Master in Policy Leadership Program at Georgetown University, Washington, D.C., Ms. Colla collaborated across multiple agencies to boost COVID-19 vaccination rates across lower-income wards in the city. She led an interdisciplinary team with areas of expertise in healthcare, education, finance, and law to use tools from Lean Six Sigma to evaluate DC Health's vaccination process. Her team developed an alternate process allowing residents to arrive at vaccination sites, be registered on site, and get vaccinated the same day. Their project increased access, optimized data tracking to increase availability, and provided alternative ways to vaccinate over 100,000 residents, including those with disabilities and restricted transportation.

From 2016 to 2020, Ms. Colla served as plans and policy supervisor, Headquarters Marine Corps (HQMC), Quantico, Virginia. There, she was the command's subject matter expert for program-related training, inspections, and site visits, leveraging a deep knowledge of legal and regulatory guidance related to sexual assault incidents, counseling and medical support situations, law enforcement actions, records and database management requirements and training.

Prior to her assignment at the USMS, Ms. Colla served as a command sexual assault response coordinator for U.S. Marine Corps Community Services. In this position, she provided guidance and direction for a team of 25 assigned uniformed victim advocates to ensure an integrated and transparent capability and system accountability for 24/7 support and services for over 12,500 active-duty personnel, 24,000 family members, and 21,000 contractors and civilians who reported as victims of sexual assault.

Ms. Colla is a U.S. Navy veteran, having served on active duty from 2002 to 2006 as a hospital corpsman in various locations such as Iraq and Guantanamo Bay, Cuba.
